

# Information for New Staff

## Structured Interdisciplinary Bedside Rounds (SIBR™)

The round for each patient takes 3-5 min

### Key Considerations

- Gather all information required prior to the round – be prepared
- Remove any interruptions (phone/pager etc.)
- Position yourself near the patient when speaking to them
- Actively engage the patient and family by talking to them and including them
- Follow the structured format and use prompt sheets so that nothing is missed
- Ensure the terminology used is patient friendly

Documentation will be completed in real time by a person decided upon by the interdisciplinary team

**Ensure Hi Level SIBR Performance**

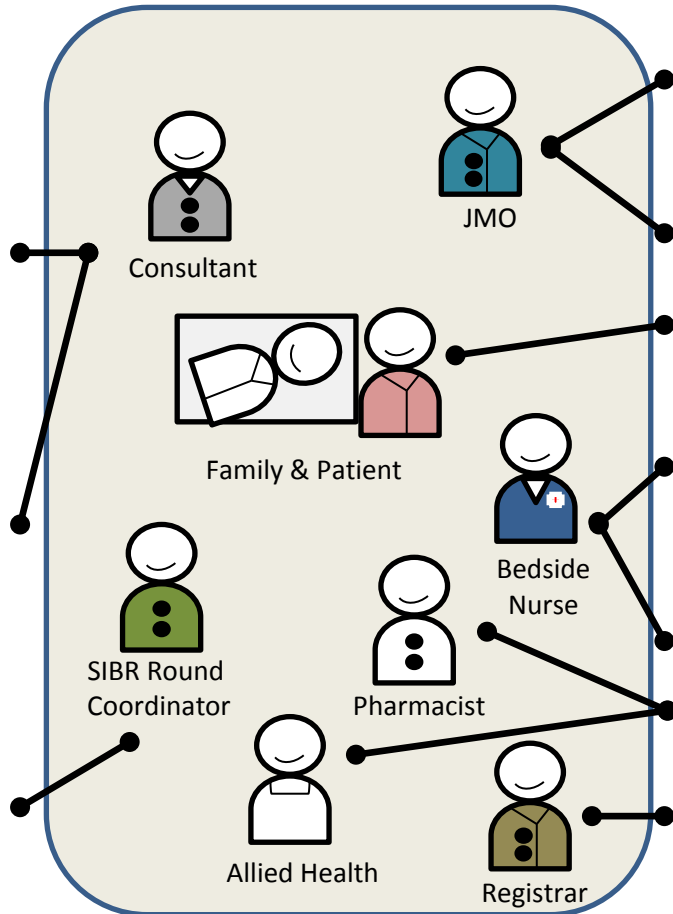
- Coach team members as needed
- Step into JMO or Registrar role as needed

**Confirm Plan for Discharge**

- Discharge needs & next site of care
- Anticipated day of discharge

**Manage SIBR Rounds**

- Ensure next bedside nurse ready for SIBR
- Orient new

(The bedside nurse will go through a checklist of clinical items to make sure nothing is missed)

**5 Allied Health Input**  
(Allied Health will provide an update on patient progress and priorities)

**6 A Plan for the Day is developed**  
(The health care team agree to the plan of the day, engaging the patient)
